### What is the HIV window period?

The **window period** for an HIV test refers to the time between HIV exposure and when a test can detect HIV in your body. The window period depends on the type of HIV test used.

**Antibody tests** can usually detect HIV 23 to 90 days after exposure. Most rapid tests and self-tests are antibody tests.

## What does a negative HIV test result mean?

A negative result doesn't necessarily mean that you don't have HIV. That's because of the <u>window period</u> — the time between HIV exposure and when a test can detect HIV in your body.

- If you get an HIV test after a potential HIV exposure and the result is negative, get tested again after the window period for the test you took.
- If you test again after the window period, have no possible HIV exposure during that time, and the result is negative, you do not have HIV.

If you're sexually active or use needles to inject drugs, continue to <u>take actions to prevent HIV</u>, like <u>taking medicines</u> to prevent HIV.

If you have <u>certain risk factors</u>, you should continue getting tested at least once a year.

If I have a negative result, does that mean my partner is HIV-negative also?

No. Your HIV test result reveals only your HIV status.
